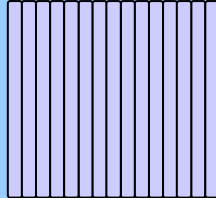


## These simple ideas go well with a range of Bible stories!

### Make a Popsicle Puzzle.

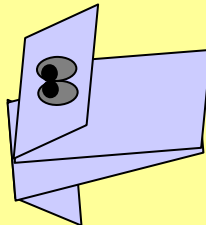
1. Line up 15 ice block sticks side by side to make a square shape.



2. Tape them together at the top and bottom with masking tape.
3. Turn them over and give them to the child.
4. Ask the child to draw a picture from the Bible story onto the sticks.
5. Take the tape off the back and muddle them up.
6. Let the child remake their puzzle, then swap puzzles and try another child's.

### Make puppets to retell the story.

1. Take a piece of light card about 15cm x 6 cm. Fold it as shown to make the mouth.



2. Insert the long folded end into a peg.
3. Draw a face on the front.
4. Open and close the peg to make the puppet talk.

### Paint a salt picture of the Bible story.

1. Give each child a piece of paper.
2. Ask them to use water colours to paint the part of the story that they thought was the most important.
3. Encourage the children to talk about their paintings and explain why they chose to paint what they did.
4. When they have finished painting, let them sprinkle salt all over the picture.
5. Let the pictures dry.
